North Carolina Community College Transfer Guide into the Belk College of Business

Prospective Business Majors:

Students seeking admission to business programs will be classified as pre-accounting, pre-business, or pre-economics majors until they qualify for admission to an upper division major. In order to qualify for an upper division major, students must:

- A. Attain junior standing (complete 60 semester hours of credit)
- B. Complete the following eight progression courses at a NC Community College with a minimum grade of C in each course.

- Note: Students may attempt each of the eight progression courses listed a maximum of two times.
- **Accounting Majors:** To be eligible for the Accounting major, students must have a B or better in ACC 120/ACCT 2121 within 2 attempts

- C. Students must earn at least a 2.5 GPA in the eight progression courses, as well as attain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5.
