



North Carolina Community College Transfer Guide into the College of Health & Human Services

All students must complete University general education requirements in addition to the following supplementary courses. [General education guidelines and course equivalencies](#) are available in the Undergraduate Admissions office. Foreign language is not required for any major within the College of Health and Human Services.

Transfer Students completing AA or AS Degrees: Students with a completed AA/AS degree will receive a General Education exemption for the Liberal Studies sequence; however, this exemption does not cover all General Education requirements. Some CHHS majors may require additional Math and Science coursework beyond what is required within AA/AS degrees. Incorporate suggested coursework below into AA/AS degrees for the most seamless transfer.

Prospective Kinesiology Majors:

Students seeking admission to the Exercise Science program will be classified as pre-kinesiology majors until they qualify for admission to an upper division major. In order to qualify for an upper division major, students must:

- Complete 36 credit hours with a minimum of GPA of 2.5
- Complete the following progression courses at a NC Community College **or** UNC Charlotte with a minimum grade of C in each course:

- Some prerequisite courses must be completed at UNC Charlotte or at an institution with an approved accredited program.
- A complete upper-division application includes: written personal statement, Dean of Students Conduct Check, and completed application forms

Prospective Health Systems Management Majors:

To progress in the Health Systems Management major, students must first:

- Attain 2.0 or higher GPA in all college courses
- Successfully complete HSMT 2101 & HSMT 2103 with grade C or better (students must have sophomore standing/30+ credit hours to take these 2 courses at UNC Charlotte).

Prospective Social Work Majors:

Transfer students will begin at UNC Charlotte as Pre-Social Work students until they qualify for the upper-division. Students will apply to the upper-division once eligible to do so, however the upper division is competitive and not all who apply can be accommodated. Students will apply to the upper division once meeting the requirements below

- Attain junior standing (complete 60 semester hours of credit) with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5
- Complete an AA/AS degree prior to transferring to earn General Education exemption **or** complete all LBST courses, writing intensive course, as well as other elective and specific population courses as required by the department
- Complete the following progression courses at a NC Community College **or** UNC Charlotte with a minimum grade of C in each course:

- Best for students to transfer for a Spring or Summer 1 term in order to complete prerequisite courses prior to upper-division starting in Fall. Applications to upper division are due no later than July 1st and students must meet the requirements above.
- A complete upper-division application includes: written essay, resume, paid/volunteer experience, and completed application forms
- Some prerequisite courses must be completed at UNC Charlotte or an institution with an approved accredited program.

Prospective Public Health Sciences Majors:

Students seeking admission to the Public Health Sciences program will be classified as pre-public health majors until they qualify for admission to an upper division major. Application to upper division is competitive and not all who apply can be accommodated. Applications to upper division are due the second Friday in February and in order to qualify, students must:

- Attain junior standing (complete 60 semester hours of credit)
- Students must earn at least a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5
- Complete the following progression courses at a NC Community College **or** UNC Charlotte with a minimum grade of C in each course:
