



North Carolina Community College Transfer Guide into the College of Health & Human Services

All students must complete University general education requirements in addition to the following supplementary courses. [General education guidelines and course equivalencies](#) are available in the Undergraduate Admissions office. Foreign language is not required for any major within the College of Health and Human Services.

 Bachelor of Science in Respiratory Therapy (BSRT) - Bachelor's Degree Completion Program Only

Prospective Kinesiology Majors:

Students seeking admission to the Exercise Science program will be classified as pre-kinesiology majors until they qualify for admission to an upper division major. In order to qualify for an upper division major, students must:

- Complete 36 credit hours with a minimum of GPA of 2.5
- Complete the following progression courses at a NC Community College with a minimum grade of C in each course.

- Some prerequisite courses must be completed at UNC Charlotte or at an institution with an approved accredited program.

Prospective Public Health Sciences Majors:

Students seeking admission to the Public Health Sciences program will be classified as pre-public health majors until they qualify for admission to an upper division major. Application to upper division is competitive and not all who apply can be accommodated. Applications to upper division are due the second Friday in February and in order to qualify, students must:

- Attain junior standing (complete 60 semester hours of credit)
- Complete the following progression courses at a NC Community College with a minimum grade of C in each course.

- Students must earn at least a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5
- Some prerequisite courses must be completed at UNC Charlotte or an institution with an approved accredited program.
- Best for students to transfer for a Spring term in order to complete prerequisite courses prior to upper-division starting in Fall

Prospective Social Work Majors:

Students seeking admission to the Social Work program will be classified as social work lower division majors until they qualify for selection as an upper division major. Application to upper division is competitive and not all who apply can be accommodated. Applications to upper division are due no later than July 1st and in order to qualify, students must:

- Attain junior standing (complete 60 semester hours of credit) with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5
- Complete the following progression courses as well as all general education requirements including Liberal Studies and Writing Intensive courses at a NC Community College with a minimum grade of C in each course.

- A complete application includes: written essay, resume, paid/volunteer experience, and completed application forms
- Some prerequisite courses must be completed at UNC Charlotte or an institution with an approved accredited program.

Prospective Health Systems Management Majors:

Students seeking admission to the Health Systems Management must first:

- Complete 45 semester hours
- Attain 2.0 or higher GPA in all college courses
- Successfully complete HSMT 2101 & HSMT 2103 with grade C or better

There are not equivalent courses to HSMT 2101 or HSMT 2103 offered at NC Community Colleges. Students should focus on general education courses and follow a similar path to Public Health to prepare for the most seamless transfer.

Prospective Respiratory Therapy Majors:

- Students seeking admission to the Respiratory Therapy program must hold a current unencumbered license as a Registered Respiratory Therapist in North Carolina or in the state of current employment.
- Students must hold a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better from their Associate Degree program that is a regionally and CAAHEP-accredited respiratory therapy program.
- Students must earn a minimum grade of "C" in all coursework taken by the end of the semester prior to the semester for which application is made.

Applicants are competitively reviewed for admission based on their cumulative GPA in all college transferrable coursework. Satisfactorily completing the minimum requirements does not guarantee admission into the program. After evaluating the credentials of all applicants meeting the minimum academic requirements, the selection committee offers admission to students whose credentials demonstrate the highest level of academic achievement. Students are admitted only for one cohort in the Fall semester.
