## North Carolina Community College Transfer Guide into the Belk College of Business

**Prospective Business Majors:**

Students seeking admission to business programs will be classified as pre-accounting, pre-business, or pre-economics majors until they qualify for admission to an upper division major. In order to qualify for an upper division major, students must:

- A. Attain junior standing (complete 60 semester hours of credit)
- B. Attain a 2.5 cumulative GPA as well as a 2.5 GPA within Business Progression Courses
- C. Complete the following eight progression courses at a NC Community College **or** UNC Charlotte with a minimum grade of C in each course:

**Special Notes:**

- Students are only allowed 2 attempts at each business progression course to earn the grade C or better required.
- All attempts at business progression courses are calculated in the Business Progression GPA.
- **Accounting Majors:** To be eligible for the Accounting major, students must have a B or better in ACC 120/ACCT 2121 within 2 attempts.
- Students are encouraged to complete the AA degree and incorporate as many business progression courses as possible into the AA degree prior to transferring.
